SUNY-Wide Success Metrics

SUNY has established core metrics to evaluate the effectiveness of new programs and policies. The system-wide targets outlined below serve as benchmarks toward which all campuses contribute. Institution-specific goals will be determined based on each campus's current performance and contextual factors.



Double the 6-year transfer baccalaureate graduation rate.

The current SUNY rate of 21% will be doubled for the 2025 cohort. SUNY institutional reporting tools will be used to perform annual assessments which will be supported by SUNY provided data dashboards.



Raise the SUNY-to-SUNY transfer rate to 60%.

SUNY data from SIRIS and SUNY institutional reporting tools will be used to assess and target a 10% improvement in the transfer admission rates (transfer-out) to demonstrate that added efforts to publicize Transfer Paths and SUNY options have an impact on enrollment.




Reduce transfer credit loss.

Using student-level transfer credit acceptance figures, SUNY will achieve 80% average acceptance, in contrast to the current 56-60% national average. Preliminary assessments indicate SUNY has 64-67% acceptance, slightly higher than the national average.



Reduce time to degree and excess credit.

Reduce excess credits accrued by associate degree starters by at least 6 credits on average. Reduce the time to degree students experience by $\frac{1}{2}$ semester on average. Currently, transfer students spend an average of 3.1 years at the 4 year institution after transferring
